Happy New Year!

As we embark on 2024 I invite Fisher/Bygland Parish membership to consider attending a discernment retreat, hosted by Trinity Lutheran in Crookston, on January 20th from 9-3:30pm.

Congregational Discernment Retreat

A retreat designed to gather church leaders in discussions about mission and future goals for their congregations. We will be using the spiritual practice of VOCARE to guide our time together. VOCARE centers discernment around three questions:



Who are we called to be? What are we called to do? Why are we here?

VOCARE is an anacronym with each letter representing a different topic of discernment.

VOCARE is a regular spiritual practice designed to help individuals and congregations to discern and embrace their multiple vocations so that they can more intentionally live life and faith on purpose for the common good. VOCARE invites ongoing reflection upon values, openness, call, attentiveness, regrets and the experience of the sacred in everyday life.

Values: What do we value, and how are we living these values?

Openness: To what is the congregation being asked to be open?

Call of God: What voices are calling to the congregation? Which ones do we listen to and why?

Attentiveness: Where is the congregation giving attention? Does this attention align with the values?

Regrets: Were there regrets or lost opportunities? What insight is gained from these?

Experiencing the Sacred: When, where, and how has the presence of the holy been encountered?

I believe there is value in congregations sharing a retreat space as they discern their own futures. This will provide an opportunity to hear what other congregations are thinking, doing discerning. There may even be some common ground where ministries might be shared or goals that might compliment another congregation. It is my hope this retreat will foster relationships as we engage a future that seems challenging and unknown.

Who should attend? Congregational leaders and others who share a vision of what their congregation could be. I would encourage one or two individuals you would consider as story-keepers/historians of the congregation. Those who would know the progression of the congregation through the years and identify who were the influencers at various stages of church life. Consider asking council members, church committee participants, people in every age category, and perhaps even your new members.

Please let me know if you have interest in attending this vital event for open conversation. I plan to attend on behalf of Fisher/Bygland Parish.

Call to order: The meeting was called to order at 7:34 pm by Barry.

Devotions: none

Agenda/addition of items-Reviewed and additions made.

Secretary's report-Rachel presented the October minutes. *A motion to approve the Secretary's report as presented was made by Randy and seconded by Ronnie; motion carried.*

Treasurer's Report-Randy presented the Treasurer's report from last month. He also provided a chart of the end of year budget results from the last 20 years. As of October 31st, we are currently at 63% of our 2023 goal. *A motion to approve the Treasurer's report was made by Kent and seconded by Ronnie; motion carried*.

Pastor's Report-In her absence, Pastor Gretchen provided the council with a video and packet of information on the Haden Institute.

Old business:

- Annual meeting was scheduled for January 28th, 2024.
- Parsonage update-Evitts Construction has finished its work on the roof and deck.
- Steeple update-Evitts has been hired to remove the damaged part of the church steeple. The goal is to complete the job this month (November).
- Follow-up from the joint council meeting. Proposals below are pending until approval is made by the Fisher council.
 - 1. Bygland council reviewed guidelines and proposed that Jami Olson (Parish secretary) receive a 4% raise in 2024.
 - 2.Bygland council proposed that Jami O. watch for upcoming sales on the chosen new computer for the parish office and then make the purchase, even though it was put in the budget for 2024.
 - **3.**Bygland council also proposed that no one may spend over designated parish budget amounts without approval. If/when parish disbursements near budget allowed amounts in the future, further purchases in that category should be approved by both councils (or reps. from both) before going over budget. Proper receipts should be maintained as well.

New business:

- •Lutefisk dinner-December 3rd. Church members met last week and reviewed plans and everything should be set. Wendy W. created a new placemat and council approved.
- •Sharing of council minutes-Fisher council would like to share meeting minutes to improve communication between churches. Bygland agreed. Council secretaries will provide each other with a copy of the minutes each

month.

A motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Alan and seconded by Ronnie; motion carried. The meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.
