

India Trip Cancelled



Bishop Wohlrabe had put together a group of 8 to travel during the month of November to attend the Pastor's Day Celebration held on Martin Luther's birthday, November 10th. Alas, it was not to be. Our group included Bishop Wohlrabe and his wife Joy, retired Concordia College professor Hank Tkachuk and his wife Lynn, myself, another pastor and two lay people from our synod. Hank died suddenly and unexpectedly on September 13. Hank was the coordinator of the trip, making all the reservations and arrangements for our travel. He had purchased the airline tickets, but none of the in-country arrangements had been made. It was decided after a couple hours long meeting of prayer and discernment, that we simply could not proceed without Hank's contributions.

Did you know that worldwide there are more Lutherans who are not Caucasian than those that are? Our missionaries from the ninetieth and twentieth centuries did good work spreading the Gospel and inviting others to be disciples of Jesus. The Andhra Evangelical Lutheran Synod was founded as a mission field of the then United Lutheran Church in America (ULCA) by John Christian Frederick Heyer on 31 July 1842. As a first step, schools were established. With new baptisms, the confidence of the missionaries increased. Later hospitals were established. Today the AELC has over 800,000 baptized members, over 5000 congregations, and 600 ordained pastors and a large number of lay workers.

We celebrate with our brothers and sisters in the Andhra Evangelical Lutheran Synod, even though we will not be together, the great things that God has done, and is doing in his church throughout the world!

The meeting was called to order @ 7:30 pm.

Pastor Karen led Devotions

<u>Secretary's Report</u> – The minutes from the July 2018 meeting were reviewed and approved by the Council on motion by J. Matthews, second my G. Kasowski.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> – The Treasurer's reports for July & August 2018 were presented by R. Tinkham and approved by the Council on motion by T. Schwarz, second my J. Solheim.

<u>Pastor's Report</u> – Pastor Karen reported that one baptism was held at Fisher Lutheran during the month of July as well as a funeral in August. Other activities noted included a Dean's Conference Call, Good Samaritan worship, VMH Board Meeting devotions, a visit by our missionaries Anne & Willie Langdji at University Lutheran Church, Conference Professional Leaders gathering at Trinity Point and Rev. Bill Reck's retirement program.

Pastor Karen is the Conference Dean for our area, and has been asked to take part in a 11 day Synod trip to India, Nov. 5 - 16. Fisher Lutheran had voted earlier to accept the Synod guidelines which allow for accumulation of unused Continuing Education days for up to three years. Pastor Karen requested using her two remaining weeks of Continuing Education from 2016 & 2017 to cover the leave. On motion by T. Schwarz, second by J. Matthews the Council granted the request.

Also noted in the Pastor's Report:

- •The WELCA Synod Convention was held Sept. 14-15 at Trinity Lutheran in Detroit Lakes
- ●The Fall Theological Conference at Fair Hills took place Sept 16-18
- •Confirmation for students in Gr. 6-8 meet on Wednesday evenings and the 9th Gr. Confirmation class would be meeting on Sept. 23
- •VMH Annual Meeting Sept. 24 @ 6:30 pm
- •Pastor Karen will be on vacation Oct. 2-8
- ●The Joint Parish Council will meet @ Bygland on Nov. 28 @ 7:30 pm

<u>Committee Reports</u> – G. Kasowski presented a report from True Home Property Solutions. It was noted that there were a few expenses for repairs and that Bygland Council members had requested that a different individual be hired to complete repairs in the future.

The Property Committee has noted that the following items need to be addressed:

The Council approved the use of the church kitchen on Nov. 11 @ 2:00 pm by the Fisher American Legion Auxiliary to prepare the Veterans Day lunch. Motion by G. Kasowski, Second by J. Matthews

There was no report available on the progress of setting up electronic giving. A suggestion was made to explore Venmo, free digital wallet that lets you make and share payments.

Approval was given to continue Portico Gold + coverage for Pastor Karen's benefits for 2019. The 2018 cost to Fisher Lutheran for this benefits plan is \$11,532.48.

Reed Tinkham declared the meeting adjourned.

Call to order-The meeting was called to order by Eric Egeland

Devotions-Pastor Karen led devotions

Agenda/addition of items was discussed-Motion to approve: Randy M., seconded by Jason T., *motion carried*.

Secretary's report-read by Wendy Waller. Motion to approve: Ronnie T., seconded by Barry T., *motion carried*.

Treasurer's report-read by Randy Moe. Motion to approve the monthly report was made by Karen E., seconded by Barry T., *motion carried*.

Financial Secretary report-We reviewed the financial secretary's report.

- •Pastor Karen has decided against switching the lectionary cycle.

New business:

- •A motion was made to grant Pastor Karen 2 weeks of continuing education time under the Synod assembly guidelines for a mission trip to India. Barry Traub made the motion, Jason T. seconded it, *motion carried*.
- •The state of MN inspected our elevator and they reported that we have repairs to make. Randy called Otis elevator and forwarded the information to them. Otis looked at the elevator and sent Randy a bill of \$2,850 to bring it up to compliance with new regulations. These repairs are not covered by our regular maintenance contract. A motion was made to make the required upgrades to our elevator to bring it up to MN code for approximately \$3000 by Barry T. and seconded by Wendy W., *motion carried*.
- •Our quilters found evidence of rodent activity recently. Godfathers exterminating has been our service. Eric is going to contact them about stopping by. Randy also brought up spraying for asian beetles. He is going to check on getting this done.
- •Eric has been approached about having the church more thoroughly cleaned once or twice a year. Options were discussed for having this done.

A motion was made by Randy M. .. to adjourn the meeting and seconded by Barry T.. The meeting was adjourned. Pastor Karen closed with the Lord's Prayer.
