### THOUGHTS FROM THE RULE OF ST. BENEDICT

Do not aspire to be called holy before you really are, but first be holy that you may more truly be called so.

Pray for your enemies out of love for Christ. If you have a dispute with someone, make peace with that one before the sun goes down.

- 7 Let my soul be at rest again, for the Lord has been good to me.
- 8 He has saved me from death, my eyes from tears, my feet from stumbling.
- 9 And so I walk in the Lord's presence as I live here on earth!
- 10 I believed in you, so I said, "I am deeply troubled, Lord."

- 11 In my anxiety I cried out to you, "These people are all liars!"
- 12 What can I offer the Lord for all he has done for me?
- 13 I will lift up the cup of salvation and praise the Lord's name for saving me.
- 14 I will keep my promises to the Lord in the presence of all his people.
- 15 The Lord cares deeply when his loved ones die.
- 16 O Lord, I am your servant; yes, I am your servant, born into your household:

you have freed me from my chains.

- 17 I will offer you a sacrifice of thanksgiving and call on the name of the Lord.
- 18 I will fulfill my vows to the Lord in the presence of all his people—
- 19 in the house of the Lord in the heart of Jerusalem.

### Bygland Lutheran Church Sunday School News

Thank you to Lloyd Omdahl for his passion in feeding the hungry and encouraging others to "send a food truck." Blessed be his memory. This year 1,284 volunteers packed 326,592 meals. This will feed 894 children, 3 meals a day, for an entire year. In addition they collected many pounds of non-perishable food items for the local

Hungry at Home Project. Organizers are confident they will again be able to offer a mobile pack for our community next year (2025).

Recognition Sunday was held on Sunday, April 28, 2024. All students were given participation awards along with special awards for attendance, sharing the love of Jesus with others, and Bible reading. We thanked all the Sunday school parents for getting their children to Sunday school, as attendance is vital to their spiritual growth. Adopt a Highway celebrates 33 years of success in keeping Minnesota highways clean, beautiful, and safe. More than 1,860 Adopt a Highway groups volunteered and picked 38,500 bags of trash in 2022. Volunteers spent 88,100 plus hours picking up litter on 900 segments of state roadways available for adoption. Thanks to the dedication of Adopt a Highway volunteers and their organizations, MnDOT is able to use the resources, that would have otherwise been used to pick up litter, for highway improvement and safety projects.

We celebrate all of those who have taken time to volunteer throughout the years in serving our state, community, and church with this endeavor. A global pandemic, political upheaval, a changing climate... these days, the future is more uncertain than it has ever been. Or is it? For the people of the Bible, life was often shaped by deep uncertainty. Encounters with God sparked awe, confusion or courage, but rarely certainty. Instead, God's people have always been called to follow God into the unknown, trusting in God's certain grace and love. This three-session summer Bible study explores God's invitation to the people of the Bible and to us, to take the holy journey beyond certainty to curiosity, community and compassion, where we find abundant life in Christ.
